Letter from Lois - November 2015

Once again our Dollar Daze event was an overwhelming success. Thank you for your donations, given in exchange for yarn not suitable for From the Heart projects. And, thanks to you we now have on hand or have ordered acrylic yarns in 18 colors (which includes variegated) in worsted weight as well as a thinner yarn for making those precious baby items. Our cubbies are packed with more coming in within the next few weeks. You have enabled us to purchase enough to keep our fingers flying for many months to come!

We do continue to offer those Dollar Daze bins at the shop. You will find them lined up in the “yarn hall” just waiting for you. Make your choices then deposit your donation in our wooden cash box in our front room.

Near the cash box you will see a small 3 shelf cabinet filled with our red, pink and purple books. On top of the cabinet you will see our suggestions box, now posing as our deposit box for \$\$ donated for our books. Our cost of printing these books was \$10.00 for both the red and the pink books. However, our newest, the purple book is a bit thicker containing many more patterns as well as lots of helpful hints and charts. The printing of this one was \$12.00 each so keep this in mind when picking up your copy to take home.

We'd love some feedback from you regarding our Dollar Daze set up. I think we did a much better job this year. Last year we had everyone crowded into the yarn hall and beyond. Not a happy situation! It was almost impossible to exit once you had entered that area plus the yarn bins were packed into such a small area it was difficult to go through them in search for that perfect, beautiful selection.

This year, with the sofas spread out and all extra furniture out of sight it was so much easier to peruse the bins. And having them up on the sofas made reaching into them a bit easier on our backs, I think. Books and magazines on the long table, up high enough one could sift through them seemed to be a plus as well.

This has been such a wonderful way to open up space taken by yarn we can't use for creating items

for donations, making room for those skeins we use daily for blankets, hats and other items. We will continue hosting our Dollar Daze each autumn...not only is it beneficial but it's soon much fun!

From the Heart Crochet-a-Long

Our first meeting for the Crochet-a-Long will be at the shop at 2pm on Saturday November 7th. At that meeting, we will hand out the first portion of the pattern and answer any questions you might have. Then you will go home and start work on the project. We will meet again on the 14th and the 21st, again at the shop at 2pm, to see our progress and pick up the 2nd and 3rd portions of the pattern. Finally, we will meet on December 5th to show off our completed projects. On that last day, please plan to bring a little treat to share. From the Heart will supply the drinks. You do not have to be able to get to the shop on all these dates. Just let me know if you want to take part and I will email you the pattern.

We are using a pattern which calls for DK weight yarn (#3 on the Craft Yarn Council Standard of Weights). There are two sizes, S-L and XL-XXL. We have a limited supply of yarn which we can make available on the 7th (sufficient for 14 people) for a donation of your choice or you can purchase your own. The size S-L calls for 1095 yards and the XL-XXL calls for 1314 yards of yarn. The original pattern uses a linen/cotton mix but we recommend getting whatever suits your fancy and, then, if you really like the end result, you can invest in something more expensive to repeat the pattern. This is an item of clothing so bear that in mind when choosing your yarn. The completed project will be yours to keep whether you purchase your yarn or make a donation for the yarn we have available.

Powhatan Festival of Fiber

Saturday, April 30th 2016 is the date of the next Powhatan Festival of Fiber. The festival, held to celebrate and to share appreciation of the many fiber

animals, fiber farmers and fiber artisans of the county and surrounding area, will be held rain or shine and is always worth attending so mark your calendar now. The festival includes demonstrations, exhibits, and classes (some of the classes are an additional cost). The event starts at 10:00am and continues until 5:00pm at 3920 Marion Harland Lane in Powhatan. The cost of admittance is \$5 for adults with children 12 and under being admitted free.

A new vendor added to the event is Gwendoline, the Yarn Truck. Gwendoline is a mini version of Knitting Addiction, on wheels.

CrossOver Healthcare Ministry which provides quality and compassionate health care to the uninsured in the greater Richmond Metropolitan area. Since 1983, CrossOver has offered a full continuum of health care services to the uninsured including family medicine, primary care, obstetrics and pediatrics, podiatry, dental and vision care, mental health care, HIV diagnosis and treatment, and critical medications. CrossOver operates 2 free clinics located in areas of identified need in Richmond and serves more than 6,800 individuals annually.

Pet cozies and pet toys to the Richmond pound, the Henrico pound, Pal (Prevent a Litter), Betty Baugh Vet, and the SPCA. We are working on creating a relationship with the Chesterfield Pound. 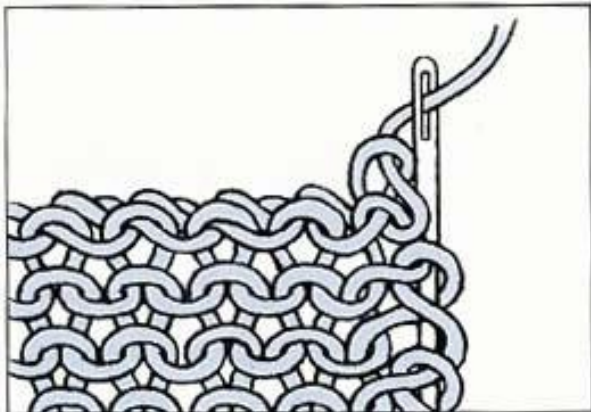
never been before, tell one of the schedulers that “Tricia sent you” and I’m sure she would be happy to give you the ‘grand tour’.

Tip of the Month

What is the best way to weave in ends?

The recommended way is to have a ~6” tail and weave in in a zigzag pattern. If you do it in a straight line it may come out when being laundered. Weave the yarn one way, then back the direction you came and then back again – so 3 weavings total going back and forth.

Ends of yarn can be woven directly into your knitting. Thread a darning needle with the end of the yarn and run it in and out in an inconspicuous place for an inch or two. Turn and repeat then turn and repeat again. Yarn is taken down, up, down the work. This gives a very secure weave. Clip remaining excess yarn.

Dylan's Turtle (Knit)

Shell:

cast on 6
stitches, row
one: knit
row two: knit one, make one
(repeat rows 1 and 2 three
times)
knit 6 rows (alternating color every 2 rows)
*knit 4, k2g*rep to end of
row knit to end of row
knit 3, k2g rep to end of
row knit to end of row
knit 2, k2g rep to end of
row knit to end of row
knit 1, k2g rep to end of
row knit to end of row
k2g rep until you have 6 stitches on your DPN's
Stuff the shell, thread tail through last 6 stitches, pull through, tighten.



Head:

Cast on 6 stitches
Knit to end of row
K1, M1 to end of
row knit to end of
row *K1, M1* to end
of row Knit 4 rows
Knit 4, ktg rep to end of
row *Knit 3, ktg* rep to end
of row *Knit 2, ktg* rep to
end of row *Knit 1, ktg* rep
to end of row
Ktg rep until you have 6 stitches left, stuff the head, thread remaining yarn through last six stitches, pull tight.

Made 4 'flippers' for legs (6 stitches for 6 rows, decrease 2, knit 3 more rows, decrease 1, knit one row, bind off) and one tail (knit 4 stitches for 3 rows, decrease two, knit for 2 rows, bind off) and sewed them all together. I tried to do everything on DPN's because I hate seaming more than anything.

Amigurumi Turtle (free from LionBrand)

Pattern Number: 70591AD

SKILL LEVEL: Easy

SIZE: One Size 2 in. (5 cm) tall

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Wool Ease: Lemongrass 1 Ball (A)
- Lion Brand Wool -Ease® Yarn Avocado 1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-6, Lion Brand Stitch Markers, Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
- Additional Materials: 2 plastic safety eyes, 6 mmdiameter Fiberfill stuffing



STITCH EXPLANATION:

sc2tog (sc decrease) Insert hook into st and draw up a loop. Insert hook into next st and draw up a loop. Yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook.

NOTES:

Work in continuous rnds; do not join or turn unless otherwise instructed.

UPPER SHELL

With A, ch 2.

Rnd 1: Work 6 sc in first ch; place a marker to indicate beg of rnd; move marker up as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around - 12 sc.

Rnd 3: *2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around - 18 sc. **Rnd 4:** *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; rep from * around - 24 sc. **Rnd 5:** *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; rep from * around - 30 sc. **Rnd 6:** *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; rep from * around - 36 sc. **Rnd 7:** *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; rep from * around - 42 sc. **Rnd 8:** *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; rep from * around - 48 sc. **Rnds 9-14:** Sc in each scaround.

Fasten off.

BOTTOM SHELL

With B, ch 2.

Rnds 1-8: Work Rnds 1-8 of Top Shell - 48 sc. Fasten off.

HEAD

With B, ch 2.

Rnd 1: Work 6 sc in first ch; place a marker to indicate beg of rnd; move marker up as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around - 12 sc.

Rnd 3: 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc - 14 sc. **Rnd 4:** 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 12 sc, 2 sc in next sc - 16 sc. **Rnd 5:** 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 14 sc, 2 sc in next sc - 18 sc. **Rnd 6:** Sc in each scaround.

Rnd 7: Sc2tog, sc in next 14 sc, sc2tog - 16 sc. **Rnd**

8: Sc2tog, sc in next 12 sc, sc2tog - 14 sc. **Rnd 9:**

Sc2tog, sc in next 10 sc, sc2tog - 12 sc. Fasten off.

LEGS (make 4)

With B, ch 2.

Rnd 1: Work 4 sc in first ch; place a marker to indicate beg of rnd; move marker as each rnd is completed.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around - 8 sc.

Rnds 3-5: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

TAIL

With B, ch 2.

Rnd 1: Work 4 sc in first ch; place a marker to indicate beg of rnd; move marker as each rnd is completed.

Rnds 2-4: Sc in each sc around - 4 sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Following package directions, attach safety eyes to Head. Stuff Upper Shell and sew to Bottom Shell. Stuff Head and sew to Shell. Stuff Legs and Tail very lightly and sew to Shell. Weave in ends.

A Cat Toy can be created very easily by crocheting or knitting a tube and then stuffing it with something crinkly such as the crumpled up bag that cereals are contained in inside the boxes. Close up the ends, add ears, whiskers, eyes, and a tail, if you like, for a mouse and you have something for a cat to bat around while being amused by the sound. Or pinch at both ends to make a fish, or just close it up for a snake....
