

A Little Bit of Lace Hat and Scarf Set

Materials:

- US # 8 Needle (double pointed and/or 16" circular and straight)
- Worsted Weight (#4) yarn, up to 600 yards, depending on how long you make the scarf
- Stitch Marker

Abbreviations:

dpn	double pointed needle
k	knit
k2tog	knit two together
p	purl
p2tog	purl two together
rep	repeat
sl	slip one stitch purlwise (i.e. slip it from the left needle to the right as if to purl but do not work it, yarn stays in front of work in preparation for working the next stitch)
sts	stitches
yo	yarn over



Hat:

Using dpns or circular needles, cast on 72 stitches and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker between first and last stitch if necessary

Work 8 rounds in k1,p1 rib and then commence pattern as follows:

Round 1:	*k5, p3, rep from * to end of round
Round 2:	*k5, p3, rep from * to end of round
Round 3:	*k5, p1, yo. P2tog, rep from * to end of round
Round 4:	*k5, p3, rep from * to end of round
Round 5:	*k5, p3, rep from * to end of round
Round 6:	k
Round 7:	k1, (p3, k5) 8 times, p3, k 4
Round 8:	k1, (p3, k5) 8 times, p3, k 4
Round 9:	k1, (p1, yo, p2tog, 5k) 8 times, p1, yo, p2tog, k4
Round 10:	k1, (p3, k5) 8 times, p3, k 4
Round 11:	k1, (p3, k5) 8 times, p3, k 4
Round 12:	k

Repeat these 12 rounds until hat is ~ 7" ending following a round 6 or 12

Decrease for crown:

If working on a circular needles, you may want to switch to dpns should the circular become uncomfortable to work with as the crown gets smaller.

Round 1: (k7, k2tog) 8 times - 64 sts on needles

Round 2: k
 Round 3: (k6, k2tog) 8 times – 56 sts on needles
 Round 3: k
 Round 4: (k5, k2tog) 8 times – 48 sts on needles
 Round 5: k
 Round 6: (k4, k2tog) 8 times – 40 sts on needles
 Round 7: k
 Round 8: (k3, k2tog) 8 times – 32 sts on needles
 Round 9: k
 Round 10: (k2, k2tog) 8 times – 24 sts on needles
 Round 11: k
 Round 12: (k1, k2tog) 8 times – 16 sts on needles
 Round 13: k
 Round 14: (k2tog) 8 times – 8 sts on needles

Using a tapestry needle, remove these 8 sts purlwise off the needles pull tightly and secure.
 Weave in all ends.

Scarf: (~8" wide. For a wider or more narrow scarf, increase or decrease sts in blocks of 8)

With #8 needles, on straight needles (or circular if you prefer) cast on 46 sts for working back and forth in rows

Row 1: k
 Rows 2 -4: sl 1, k to the end of the row then commence pattern as follows

Row 1: sl 1, k2, (k5, p3) 5 times, k3
 Row 2: sl 1, k2, (k3, p5) 5 times, k3
 Row 3: sl 1, k2, (k5, p1, yo, p2tog) 5 times, k3
 Row 4: sl 1, k2, (k3, p5) 5 times, k3
 Row 5: sl 1, k2, (k5, p3) 5 times, k3
 Row 6: purl
 Row 7: sl 1, k3, (p3, k5) 4 times, p3, k7
 Row 8: sl 1, k2, p4, k3, (p5, k3) 4 times, p1, k3
 Row 9: sl 1, k3 (p1,yo, p2tog, k5) 4 times, p1, yo, p2tog, k7
 Row 10: sl 1, k2, p4, k3, (p5, k3) 4 times, k4
 Row 11: sl 1, k3, (p3, k5) 4 times, p3, k7
 Row 12: purl



Continue this 12 row pattern until scarf is almost as long as you want it or until you have only a small amount of yarn left, then do 4 more rows as follows:

sl 1 stitch, k to the rest of the row for 3 rows
 Last row is all k including the first stitch
 Cast off and weave in ends.
