

Child's Crocheted Scarf

Materials:

Worsted Weight (#4) yarn in a soft acrylic – this can be one skein of Caron Simply Soft (for example) for a combination of many colors of left over yarn. (Approx. 132 yards needed for the child's scarf)

Size I Crochet hook

Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

Note:

Although the pattern below is for a child's scarf, this pattern is easily made larger by chaining a longer starting chain and by repeating row 3 more than 3 times (be sure to do the same number of repeats before and after the row in which the keyhole is created)

Finished Size:

Approx. 4 1/2" wide by 36" long

Abbreviations:

ch chain
st(s) Stitch(es)
sc Single crochet
dc Double crochet

Pattern:

Row 1: Ch 109, turn

Row 2: sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each st across, ch 3, turn

Row 3: dc in each st across, ch 3, turn

Rows 4, 5, 6: Repeat Row 3, three more times.

Row 7: dc 20, ch 16 and skip 16 st, dc into the 17th st and finish row by dc in each st across. ch 3

Rows 8, 9, 10: Repeat row 3, three times. Be sure to dc into the ch and not into the large ch space.

This will keep your stitches spread evenly and prevent bunching.

Row 11: dc in each st across, ch 1, turn

Row 12: sc in each st across.

Tie off and weave in ends.
