

## Reversible Two Color Knitting Class – Kulla Ficare

This is the easiest two color or double knitting method I have found. With most patterns you must work with both colors at the same time which is slow and cumbersome. With this method, you work each color separately. It is a four row repeat and must be worked on circular or double-pointed needles.

### IMPORTANT TIPS:

1. Before you begin, record your color A and color B yarns in your notes.
2. You must always cast on an even number of stitches in Color A.
3. Be attentive at the end of rows 2 and 4 when both strands are together at the same end.
4. When changing colors, be sure to pick up the new strand from under the old one. This will twist the two yarns together at the edge thereby preventing any holes.
5. The double fabric may be closed at the top by binding off all stitches in the usual manner or you can leave the fabric open to create a pouch. To accomplish this, slip all the A stitches onto one needle and the B stitches on another. Bind off each color separately.
6. *Cast on twice as many stitches as needed as the finished fabric will result in approximately half of the width of a single thickness.*

### Pattern

Cast on an even number of stitches in Color A.

Row 1 – With B, \*k1, sl 1 wyif; rep from \*. Slide stitches to other end of needle and bring up Color A.

Row 2 – With A, \*sl 1 wyib, p1; rep from \*. Turn work and bring up Color B.

Row 3 – With B, \*sl 1 wyib, p1; rep from \*. Slide stitches to other end of needle and bring up Color A.

Row 4 – With A, \*k1, sl 1 wyif; rep from \*. Turn work and take up Color B.

Repeat rows 1 – 4 until you have reached the desired length.
