

Ebb and Flow Hat and Short Scarf Set

- Materials:** Approximately 600 yards of #4 (Worsted Weight) yarn (200 for hat and 400 for short scarf – a longer scarf will need more yarn)
 US #8 double pointed needles
 US #8 24” or 29” circular needles for the scarf
 Stitch markers, 7 of one color and 1 of a different color for 8 total
 Tapestry needle for weaving in ends
- Gauge:** 20 sts/ 28 rows= 4” in stockinette stitch, give or take a little as pattern is very stretchy

Abbreviations:

- K = knit
 P = purl
 K2tog = knit 2 together
 P2tog = Purl 2 together
 Rep = repeat
 Rnd(s) = Round(s)
 Yo = Yarn over
 SM = Slip marker



Pattern for Hat:

Cast on 88 stitches using double pointed needles and join to knit in the round, being careful not to twist stitches. Place unique colored marker to note beginning of Rnd.

Rnd 1-10: Knit all stitches.

Rnds 11-15: Purl all stitches.

Rnds 16-20: Knit all stitches.

Repeat Rounds 11-20 additional 4 times (total of 5 times)

Crown shaping (for hat only):

Rnd 1: *P9. P2tog – Rep from * around placing markers immediately following P2togs (80 sts)

Rnd 2: P slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 3: P slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 4: *P8, (this will place you 2 sts before maker) P2tog, SM – Rep from * around (72 sts)

Rnd 5: P slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 6: K slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 7: *K7 (this will place you 2 sts before marker), K2tog, SM – Rep from * around (64 sts)

Rnd 8: K slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 9: K slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 10: *K6 (this will place you 2 sts before marker), K2tog, SM – Rep from * around (56 sts)

Rnd 11: P slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 12: *P5 (placing you 2 sts before marker), P2tog; rep from * around (48 sts)

Rnd 13: P all stitches, slipping markers as you come to them



Rnd 14: *P4 (placing you 2 sts before marker), P2tog; rep from * around (40 sts)

Rnd 15: P all stitches, slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 16: *K3 (this will place you 2 sts before marker), K2tog, SM – Rep from * around (32 sts)

Rnd 17: K slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 18: *K2 (this will place you 2 sts before marker), K2tog, SM – Rep from * around (24 sts)

Rnd 19: K slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 20: *K1 (this will place you 2 sts before marker), K2tog, SM – Rep from * around (16 sts)

Rnd 21: P slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 22: *P2tog; rep from * until the end of the Rnd. (8 sts)

Finishing:

Cut yarn (leaving approx. 20cm long tail), and thread through remaining stitches purlwise with a darning needle. Pull tight to close the hole. Weave in all ends.

Pattern for Scarf:

This is a shorter length scarf, intended of be tucked into the top of a coat or jacket. It is about 30” long. For a longer scarf, cast on more stitches remembering that 20 sts = approximately 4”. So, for a 34” scarf, you would cast on 170 stitches, for 38”, cast on 190 sts and so forth.

Cast on 150 stitches using circular needles

Rows 1-10: Knit all stitches.

Rows 11-15: Purl all stitches.

Rows 16-20: Knit all stitches.

Repeat Rows 11-20 additional 3 times (total of 4 times)

Bind off and weave in ends.
