

## Reversible Crocheted Slip Stitch Scarf

### Finished Measurement:

6" wide by 50" long

### Note:

This pattern is an intermediate or advanced beginner pattern.

### Materials:

US size K crochet hook  
Approx. 280 yards Worsted Weight (#4) acrylic yarn.

### Abbreviations

BLOslst	Slip stitch in the back loop only (see note below)*
Ch	Chain
sl st	Slip Stitch



\*Slip stitch in the back loop only (BLOslst): Insert crochet hook in the top back loop (the loop that is furthest from you) of designated stitch, yarn over and pull loop through stitch and loop on hook.

**Gauge** measured flat and at rest (not stretched):

Stitch Gauge: 24 BLOslst (slip stitches worked in the back loop) = 6" (15 cm)

Row Gauge: 16 ribs (row pairs) = 6" (15 cm)

This is given as a guide and it is not essential that your work exactly match this gauge. However, it should be close.

### Pattern:

Make a slip knot and place on crochet hook. Ch 25.

**Row 1:** Skip ch nearest the hook, sl st in one loop only of each remaining ch: 24 sl sts. Ch 1 being careful to keep an even tension, turn.

**Row 2:** BLOslst in each sl st: 24 BLOslsts. Ch 1 keeping your tension even, turn.

**Rows 3 - 250:** Repeat Row 2.

**Tip:** For easy row counting, count the ribs (the raised ridges of the fabric). Each rib equals two rows, so 250 rows will yield 125 ribs. There is no right side or wrong side of this fabric.
