

Slip Stitch Hat and Scarf Set

Materials:

Approximately 800 yards #4 Worsted Weight yarn for the scarf and an additional 400 for the hat.
(Slip stitch patterns require more yarn than normal)

US #9 straight needles for the scarf, 16" circular and double points (US#9) for the hat

Stitch Markers (1 unique color and 8 additional markers of a different color)

Tapestry needle

Note:

This pattern is written for a man's hat and scarf set but can easily be made smaller by using a lighter weight yarn and needles one size larger than what is called for on the yarn band. The pattern(s) should be worked as they are described below. The scarf using 800 yards comes out to be about 60" long. For a woman's scarf, make it about 55" long, for a child make it about 50" long.

Gauge:

Not important as it will depend on what yarn/needle size you are working with

Abbreviations:

bo bind off

co cast on

k knit

k2tog knit the next 2 sts together – 1 st decreased

p purl

p2tog purl the next 2 sts together – 1 st decreased

pssso pass the first slipped stitch over the second slipped stitch (decrease of 1 st)

rep repeat

rnd(s) round(s)

rs right side of work

sl slip stitch purl wise (insert the needle as if to purl the next stitch but, instead, slip it to the right hand needle without working it)

sl2 slip the next 2 stitches onto the right hand needle without working them

st(s) Stitch(es)

Scarf Pattern:

Co 37 sts

Rows 1-2: k

Row 3: sl1, *(k2, sl1), rep from * to last 3 sts, k2, p1 (rs of work)

Row 4: sl1, *(k2,p1), rep from * to end of row

Rep rows 3 and 4 until your scarf is as long as you want it.

k 2 rows

Bind off and weave in ends



Scarf Stitch Detail

Hat Pattern:

Pattern is written for a man's hat as it uses a #9 needle and worsted weight yarn but can be made smaller by using lighter weight yarn and a needle one size larger than stated on the ball band. Work the pattern as written for all weights of yarn but note that the length of the hat is different depending on whether it is intended for a child, woman, or man.*

Using 16" #9 needle, co 108 sts and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist stitches and placing the unique marker to denote the beginning of each round.

k 4 rnds

Rnd 5: *(k2, sl1) rep from * around

Rnd 6: *(p2, k1) rep from * around

*Rep rnds 5 and 6 until hat is

5.5" for a child's hat

7" for a woman's hat

8" for a man's hat

AND AT THE SAME TIME, on the last row (which will be a rnd 6, place a marker after every 12th stitch, leaving the unique colored marker as is). You will have 9 markers in total.

Decrease for crown:

Rnd 1: *((k2, sl1) x3, k2tog, sl1)) rep from * around slipping markers as you come to them. – 9 sts decreased. 99 sts.

Rnd 2: *((p2, k1) x3, p1, k1)) rep from * around slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 3: *((k2, sl1) x3, k2tog)) rep from * around slipping markers as you come to them – 9 sts decreased – 90 sts.

Rnd 4: *((p2, k1) x3, k1)) rep from * around slipping markers as you come to them

Rnd 5: *((k2, sl 1) x2, k2, sl2, pss0)) rep from * around – decrease of 9 sts – 81 sts.

Rnd 6: p2, k1 around

Rnd 7: *(k2, sl1, k2, sl1, k2tog, sl1) rep from * around slipping markers as you come to them – 9 sts decreased – 72 sts

Rnd 8: *(p2, k1, p2, k1, p1, k1) rep from * around

Rnd : *(k2,sl1, k2, sl1, k2tog) rep from * around (63 sts)

Rnd 10: *(p2, k1, p2, k2) rep from * around

Rnd 11: *(k2, sl1, k2, sl2, pss0) rep from * around (54 sts)

Rnd 12: *(p2, k1, p2, k1) rep from *around

Rnd 13: *(k2, sl1, k2tog, sl1) rep from * around (45 sts)

Rnd 14: *(p2, k1, p1, k1) rep from * around

Rnd 15: *(k2, sl1, sl1, k1, pss0) rep from * around (36 sts)

Rnd 16: *(p2, k2) rep from * around

Rnd 17: *(k2, sl1, k1, pss0) rep from * around (27 sts)

Rnd 18: *(p2, k1) rep from * around

Rnd 19: *(k2tog, sl1) rep from * around (18 sts)

Rnd 20: *(k2tog) rep from * around (9sts)

Cut yarn. Using tapestry needle, thread yarn through sts purl wise and snug up. Weave in ends.
