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
## 2014 From the Heart Annual Retreat Update - "Back to the Basics"

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### **Letter from Lois - August 2014**

Your may remember in my Letter from Lois in June I mentioned how we would like to be able to "spread our love" to other communities in Virginia. From this suggestion we have had a number of calls and emails from outlying areas interested in having a little help with their start up attempts. To date we have gotten a nice group of stitchers on board in Farmville, anxious to make a difference in their community. On my very first visit to them they already had 47 projects completed and have many facilities in mind as recipients! They are on their way to making a difference right there in their own neighborhoods!

On another note, you may also remember our notices to you regarding helping folks in Wise county and surrounding areas. Well, you really came through for them! We were able to donate many, many items from our own closets as well as bags and bags of hand stitched projects. The volunteers delivering to them as well as the recipients were overwhelmed with our generosity!

I understand the volunteers as well as the doctors and dentists were working in an open fairground location in less than ideal conditions...it was cold and rainy their entire 3 days there!! The lines were long waiting for treatments, the patients were getting wet and soggy, babies were crying and miserable. Then the teenagers in the volunteer force got the great idea of wrapping wet babies in our blankets, wrapping other blankets around the shoulders of parents and distributing hats and scarves to everyone! Even dentists were seen working on extracting teeth while clad in our hats! I understand it looked like a Minnie Pearl convention with all the From the Heart dove tags flapping in the wind! I would have loved to have seen that first hand! What a sight it must have been.

The help for that region doesn't stop there. We believe we have once again been able to connect with their hospital and school as we have in the past and will be helping make a difference in that remote, depressed area. We may even be able to help them learn to stitch, assist them in finding yarn sources in an attempt at helping themselves. What a great thing that would be! This is still in the works but I'm sure you will be hearing more of this as we work to find a way to make it all happen.

And last, maybe...just maybe...we may have a free location to hold get-togethers in the Brandermill, Woodlake, Ashbrook, Hampton Park area. I don't have it fully worked out but it certainly looks promising! More on this the moment it all comes together. Any ideas you may have in reaching folks in those areas with invitations to joining in the fun would be welcome.

## Baby Hat Information

There are some things we stitchers need to remember as we are making the full term baby hats. The hats need to be at least 12" circumference and at least 6 inches long. It is much better to have a hat that needs to be turned up a little than one that won't come down to the baby's ears. They also need to have some stretch.

There is a 44 stitch hat made with Jiffy yarn in a 2 x 2 ribbing on the FTH website -[Newborn Baby Knitted Hat](#) with picture. For those who want to crochet, there is a crocheted baby hat pattern on the website - [Crocheted baby hat](#). Both patterns are also reprinted below.

### 44 Stitch Baby Hat – Lois Moore

1 skein Jiffy in pastel color will make 2 of these little hats with yarn left over.

Using either long size 10 needle for magic loop or double point needles.

(16" circular is not suitable for knitting these small tube hats.)

Cast on 44 stitches. Join carefully being certain stitches are not twisted.

Work in knit 2; purl 2 ribbing for 28 rows.

Decreases rows are very simple. During the first row you will knit the knits and purl the 2 purls together.

On second row knit the knits together and purl the purl as follows:

Row 29: Knit 2, purl 2 together. Repeat around the row. 33 stitches remain.

Row 30: Knit 2 together, purl 1. Repeat around the row. 22 stitches remain.

Row 31: Knit 2 together. Repeat around the row. 11 stitches remain.

Row 32: Knit 2 together to last stitch, knit 1. 6 stitches remain.

Cut yarn, thread thru tapestry needle, pull thru remaining 6 stitches,

Snug up smoothly, weave in tail. Weave in tail at beginning cast on. Voila! It's done

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### Crocheted Baby Hat - Created by Eleanor Cannon

F hook and Sport Weight Yarn (I used Baby Soft)

To begin: Chain 27 - NOTE: Turn and ch 1 at the end of all odd rows.

Row 1 – sc in 2nd chain from hook and in each chain across (26 sc)

Row 2 – sc in 20 sc (do not sc in last 6 sc), turn (do not ch 1)

Row 3 – sc in 20 sc back to beginning

Row 4 – sc in 20 sc and in 2 sc in Row 2 (22 sc) (do not sc in last 4 sc in Row 2) turn (do not ch 1)

Row 5 – sc in 22 sc back to beginning

Row 6 – sc in 22 sc and in 2 sc in Row 2 (24 sc) (do not sc in last 2 sc in Row 2) turn (do not ch 1)

Row 7 – sc in 24 sc back to beginning

Row 8 – sc in 24 sc and in remaining 2 sc in Row 2 (26 sc), turn (do not ch 1)

Row 9 – sc in 26 sc back to beginning.

Repeat Rows 2 thru 9 for following measurement:

Approximate hat size guideline (circumference):

12" Preemie

14" Newborn

16" Baby (approx. 3- to 6-month old)

Finish off; leave a long tail for sewing up seam. Fold piece in half and sew two sides together to form hat. Run yarn through stitches at top of hat to

close. Turn up about a 2" cuff when finished.

You can experiment with a G or H hook and other yarns to make larger hats.

## New Patterns from Johnnie's Heart

You may recall, I recently sent out an email with a promise of a new pattern for a Crocheted Breathing Square from Fredericksburg's Johnnie Wood. The pattern is below along with a second pattern Johnnie has also developed for a Knitted Basketweave Scarf.



In answer to a question I have gotten from a couple of people "What is a breathing square?", a breathing square is a square of approximately 8-9" (either knit or crochet) which can be held and 'fondled' by a person when there is a need for 'distraction'. One example would be an elderly person with, e.g. Alzheimer's, whose hands wander aimlessly looking for 'something to do' - a breathing square provides needed relief for those hands and calms the person's mind. Another would be for use as a distraction when a person is undergoing breathing therapy for serious lung or heart issues. It has been proven many times that concentrating on the act of breathing when the lungs are under stress can be counter-productive. A breathing square diverts the attention to the hands and makes the act of breathing a little easier for these folks.



The breathing square pattern is a great use of leftovers, very fast to make and depending on the colors looks like a Belgium Waffle. Extend the work beyond the square and it becomes a super-cool looking scarf. Many, many thanks to Johnnie for working on these for us :-). Both Patterns can be found at the back of this newsletter

## Attention FTH Stitchers - Our new 'magic' number is 2,503

When you look at our grand total of items donated, it currently stands at 197,497. Lois looked at the number, calculated a little and discovered if we donate **834 items every week from now until the Retreat we will hit the 200,000 mark**. This seems like a lot but we can do it. After all, we have brought it down from 4022 to 2503 in approximately 10 days. Want to try something different for that '*motivational change of pace*'? Check out Johnnie Wood's two new patterns at the end of this newsletter.

We have amazing numbers of items turned in and donated each week by all our wonderful groups in Carson, Colonial Heights, Dinwiddie, Emporia, Fredericksburg, Hopewell, King George, Powhatan, Prince George, Roanoke, our new Farmville group, and all the Richmond groups! If each of our current members only stitched and turned in one item a week from now until the Retreat we would easily meet our 200,000 goal. We know some of you just can't stand to do just one item a week and we certainly don't want to put limits out there for you.

So... with hooks and needles at the ready - Keep stitching, please!

## JOHNNIE'S WAFFLE SQUARE - Johnnie Wood

### Materials

- 2 strands contrasting colors worsted weight yarn (such as Caron)
- L hook (or size needed to achieve gauge)

Dimensions 10" X 10"

Chain 25 loosely

Row 1: DC (double crochet) in the 4th chain from hook, DC to end. ALL of the turn chains count as DC stitches.

(You should have 23 double crochet stitches in Row 1.) Chain 3 and turn.

Row 2: \*FP/DC (front post double crochet) in the next DC, DC in the next DC\*. Repeat \* to \*. This simply means alternating FP/DC and DC until you reach the end. End row 3 with a DC in the top of the end chain. (12 DC and 11 FP/DC). Chain 3 and turn.

Row 3: \*DC in next st, FP/DC in next st\*. Repeat \* to \*. End Row 3 with FP/DC and NOT a DC in the top of the end chain. Chain 3 and turn.

Alternate Rows 2 and 3 until you reach 10 inches and finish off.

Your tension and hook size will determine number of rows needed to make a 10" square. This pattern works up beautifully into a scarf or blanket. If you need to adjust the beginning chain, just be sure to chain an odd number

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## JOHNNIE'S BASKET WEAVE SCARF (finished size 8 1/2 x 45") - Johnnie Wood

### MATERIALS

Worsted weight yarn 6 1/2 oz. (190) grams, 410 yards

Straight needles, size 10 (6.00 mm) or size needed for gauge

LOWER BAND            Cast on 38 sts. loosely

Row 1: (K1, P1)

Row 2: (P1, K1)

Row 3: repeat row 1

BODY                    Row 1: P1, K1, P1, (K4, P4) 4 TIMES, K1,P1,K1

Row 2: K1, P1, K5, (P4, K4) 3 TIMES, P5, K1, P1

Rows 3-6: repeat row 1 and 2 twice

Row 7: P1, K1, P5, (K4,P4) 3 TIMES, K5,P1,K1

Row 8: K1, P1, K1, (P4,K4) 4 TIMES, P1,K1,P1

Rows 9-12 repeat 7 and 8 twice

Repeat rows 1-12 for pattern until scarf measures 44 1/4 " from cast on edge, ending by working row 6 or row 12.

UPPER BAND            Row 1: P1,K1 across

Row 2: K1, P1 across

Rows 3-5: repeat rows 1 and 2 once

Bind off loosely and add fringe if desired
