Chesterfield County Parks and Recreation is hosting CAMP GETAWAY for adults age 50+ at Stonebridge Recreation Center, 230 Karl Linn Drive, North Chesterfield from August 19 through the 22, 2019.

Darlene Holland, Recreation Activity Specialist IV has requested the help of From the Heart volunteers on August 20th only from 9 am - 11 am for a learn to knit or crochet class session in one of their class rooms with 10 or 12 of their “campers”.

Some of these seniors have been members of FtH for many years and we are looking forward to giving a hand with this class. However, we need as many “helpers” as possible in order for this session to flow smoothly. If you can possibly lend your hands and knowledge, we would greatly appreciate it!

Our normal method of teaching knitting is simply to teach a slip knot and a knitted cast on. For these we have printed handouts to assist. From there we have the student accumulate 20 to 25 stitches on their needles and work towards a garter stitch square until they feel confident with their knowledge.

When we teach newbies to crochet, we start with teaching the slip knot then progress to chain stitch. From there we go on with single crochet and if the student masters that we will move on to other stitches such as double crochet.

We’ve found that, using these simple methods, even our newest, beginner stitchers can easily pass along their skill to others!

Slang for Stitchers

This guide is offered to help you understand some common slang used by stitchers.

Cake – Yarn wound into a cylindrical shape

CAL – Crochet Along

DS – De-Stash (to sell or trade yarn)

Flashing – Similar to “Pooling” (see below) but more linear

Frog – The act of ripping or pulling out yarn as in “rip it, rip it, rip it”

Frog Pond – Storage place for items waiting to be frogged

HOTH – Hot Off The Hook

KAL – Knit Along

Muggle – One who does not knit/crochet

OCD – Obsessive Crochet Disorder

OTN – On The Needles

PABLE – Pattern Accumulation Beyond Life Expectancy

PIGS – Projects In Grocery Sack

POOLING – When one color in a variegated yarn bunches together

PUDDLING – Similar to pooling but more like a blotch

SABLE – Stash Acquisition Beyond Life Expectancy

SEX – Stash Enhancement experience (aka buying more yarn)

STASH – Special Treasures All Secretly Hidden

TOAD – Trashed Object Abandoned in Disgust

UFO – Un-Finished Object (abandoned or neglected WIP)

USO – Un-Started Object

WIP – Work in Progress

WIVSP – Work In Very Slow Progress

YAP – Yet Another Project

Yarn Barf or Yarn Vomit – A big, uncontrollable lump of yarn that comes out of a new skein

Yarn Bomb – Decorative knit or crocheted fixtures found in public places

YARNIE – Lover of all that is the glorious world of yarn

YART – Yarn Acquisition Road Trip

Richmond Dollar Daze – Saturday October 19th

We have chosen the date of Saturday, October 19th as the day of the Richmond Dollar Daze event this Fall.

If you are not familiar with the concept of Dollar Daze, From the Heart receives quite an amount of yarn

during the year which is not suitable for the work we do (silks, mohair, cashmere, linen and so forth). We categorize this yarn and, in some cases, mark it with its original price.

Once or twice a year, we offer this yarn to our members for a donation. Depending on the yarn, we sometimes suggest a donation of approximately 1/3 the original but we also offer quite a lot for a suggested donation of \$1/skein. With the money we receive at these events, we purchase acrylic yarn which we can use for our clients.

We will also have needles, hooks, accessories, and books on hand so save the date now 😊

Current Needs (August 2019)

Richmond and Surrounding areas have a need for:

- Cotton blend (it is softer than 100% cotton) hats in all sizes and colors (for men, women, and children)
*see note below

Fredericksburg/King George has a need for:

- Baby items (blankets, hats, sweaters, etc.)
- Cotton blend hats in all sizes

As our most pressing need, pretty much everywhere at the moment, is cotton blend hats, you will find patterns for both a crocheted and a knitted cotton hat towards the back of this Newsletter. We have Styrofoam balls at the workshop if you need to check that your hat will fit who you intended it to fit.

*The local hospitals are no longer accepting hats for preemies and, in some cases, they no longer accept hats for full-term babies, so we are not requesting baby hats at the moment. Please note, we do not have a need for scarves at the moment. Also, no loomed hats please.

We give you our current needs because these are our most pressing items. Feel to work on whatever you enjoy. We can find an outlet for anything you donate.

Episcopal Campus Ministry at VCU

From the Heart has been contacted by The Reverend Kimberly Reinholz, the campus ministry chaplain for Episcopal Campus Ministry at VCU. Rev. Reinholz would like to coordinate a knitting/crocheting project for Episcopal Campus Ministry at VCU to make caps for From the Heart. There can be anywhere from 2 to 12 students show up for this Ministry's Wednesday SERVANT lunch program, which connects students to non-profit organizations in the Richmond area to serve others. From the Heart has been invited to attend a lunch on Wednesday, October 30th to speak to the students about what we do, show them some of the items we create, and offer a short knitting and crocheting class. The Workshop will be closed for "regular" business and the Elf Training Workshop will happen twice, once in the morning and again in the afternoon. From the Heart will provide drinks and nibbles at around noon.

Although the Workshop will be officially closed, we will not turn away anybody who shows up with a donation. They will be "used" to show future Elves how to greet, tag, sign items in, assist with yarn selection, give the "Grand Tour", etc.

We will have yarn, patterns and help available. We are going to do a yarn swap - bring those skeins you don't like and swap for something you would like to work with. Is there something you need help with? Bring it with you and we will find someone to help you. Something you want to learn, let me know asap and we will try to add a class for that topic. See how leftovers can make up into useful beautiful items. All items completed will be delivered to various groups in the community.

Bring your tools and a dish to share and come for a fun filled day! Plates, napkins, cups, bowls, utensils, coffee, hot tea and bottled water will be provided. The building has a large kitchen for our use. We will need both a setup and clean up team so let us know which you are able to help with. Calling All Elves

Lois has asked that all Elves be reminded that, as much as possible, when an item comes into the workshop it should be tagged with the appropriate tag(s) and, then, put into the appropriate bin in the workroom. Please do not leave completed projects in the bins by the front door unless there is insufficient time left in the day to tag and bin them. In all cases, a white dove tag needs to be attached, with white yarn, to finished items. If an item is known to contain wool (except for acrylic/15% washable wool yarn), a piece of red yarn is attached to the item in addition to the dove tag. If you know which bin to place the item in, please do so. For example, if an item is obviously a baby blanket, place that in the baby blanket bin. If you don't know, e.g. whether an item is a lap blanket or a baby blanket, please leave on the table for the Distribution Team to make the call. Thanks all.

Purple Blankets not Needed at the Moment

We have collected enough purple blankets for HDH for the time being. The remaining purple yarn at the workshop can now be used for From the Heart's other outreaches so feel free to take it for any other project you would like to work on.

Thank you for, once again, filling a need so quickly and so well.

Tip of the Month

When you leave leftover yarn at the shop (or, indeed, when you are saving your leftovers for your own future use), keep the label with it and store it in a baggy to keep it nice and clean. If you don't have the label, write on the outside of the baggy what it is, for example, "#4 worsted weight acrylic" or "#3 sports weight cotton". This will make it much easier to use the leftovers in the future and/or combine many leftovers to create a new item such as a multi-colored blanket.

Men's Cotton Skull Cap

Approx. 2 oz. Cotton or cotton blend and H hook.
Ch. 4, join in round with sl st.

- Round 1:** Ch 3, 15 dc in ring (16 dc)
Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each dc around (32 dc)
Round 3: Ch 3, dc in same st, *(dc in 3 dc, 2dc in next dc) repeat from * around ending dc in 3 dc, slip st to beginning st. (40 dc)
Round 4: Ch 3, dc in same st, *(dc in 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc) repeat from * around ending dc in 4 dc, slip st to beginning st. (48 dc)
Round 5: Ch 3, dc in same st, *(dc in 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc) repeat from * around ending dc in 5 dc, slip st to beginning st. (56 dc)
Round 6: Ch 3, dc in same st, *(dc in 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc) repeat from * around ending dc in 6 dc, slip st to beginning st (64 dc)
Round 7-11: Ch 3, dc in each dc around
Round 12: Ch 1, sc in each dc around.
Round 13-16: Ch 1, sc in each sc around. Weave in end.



Note:

Depending on how loose or tight you crochet; you may want to vary the hook size by using one size smaller or larger.

Hand Knit Basic Hat in Sizes Toddler to Adult

Child sized 3 – 9 years (10 – 13) (teen – adult)

Size 8 or 9 needles

Usually a hat to fit a 21” or 22” head works well. It’s best to check your stitch gauge for the yarn you are using.

Cast on 60 (68) (72) stitches.

- Row 1:** K2, P2, K2 across line ending with P2.
Rows 2 – 6: Repeat Row 1.
Row 7: Knit across.
Row 8: Purl across.
Repeat these last two rows until the hat is 8” (9 ½”) (10”) from the start, ending on a purl row.
Next Row: K2 together across the row.
Next row: Purl
Next row: K2 together across the row.
Last row: Purl across. Cut a 14” tail of yarn, thread a yarn needle with it. Carefully pull the last row of knitting from the needle and thread the needle through every stitch. Pull tightly and then whip stitch the seam shut.
