Remember that the completed shawls need to be back in the workshop by the end of February, so you still have time to get one if you have not yet done so. Once you have taken your bag home,



along with the pattern you've selected from the binder at the workshop, reach in without looking and pull out your first ball of yarn to start work. It is a good idea to read the pattern first as there is at least one pattern which calls for working with two yarns at the same time. If that

is the case for you, just reach in and pull out a second ball of yarn and, then, off you go.



If you decide to use your own favorite pattern instead of one of the ones in the binder, that is fine too.

FTH Volunteers in Atlanta?



Yes, you read that correctly. Are you surprised to learn that we have volunteers in many states? The group, previously known as the SunTrust Stitchers, now Truist Stitchers, has stitchers located in several states; Georgia, Florida, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia - - just to name a few.

The Atlanta group, comprised of approximately 20 members (and growing!) enjoyed a very successful year in 2019. Two members of this group, Denise Rumph and Angela Johnson, have been participating in FTH projects for years. In 2019 a former Richmond resident and FTH volunteer, Laverne Benton, moved to Atlanta and joined forces with them to form a very active and productive group.

This group, known locally at work as the Atlanta Peachtree Stitchers, donated 228 red baby hats to From the Heart last year. As a result, From The Heart inspired these women to expand their efforts within their community.

So, they picked up their hooks and needles and delivered items to organizations within the Atlanta community. The Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Hughes Spalding Hospital received 75 items comprised of baby and children's hats, blankets, booties and "Loveys" in 2019. They participated in Lion Brand's "Hat Not Hate" blue hat project by donating 28 blue hats. These ladies donated hats, gloves, mittens, blankets and lapghans totaling 75 items to the Grady Health Foundation – Cancer Treatment facility. They also donated comfort pillows to the families of the Sebring victims in Sebring, Florida.

They are on track for another productive, stitching year in 2020. Happy New Stitches, ladies!

It is wonderful to know that an idea born in Central Virginia in 2001 has inspired others locally and afar to sew, crochet or knit for others in need.

Tip of the Month

A Crochet Hook is a Knitter’s Best Friend

4 reasons come to mind immediately as to why a crochet hook is indispensable to a knitter. They are:

Fixing dropped stitches

If you drop a stitch, you don't have to rip back your work, even if it's laddered several rows down. Just insert the crochet hook in the lowest of the rows to which the stitch has dropped, hook the next rung of the ladder and pull it through the loop of the dropped stitch. Repeat until you get to your working row and put the stitch on the needle.

Picking up stitches to knit

When your pattern calls for picking up stitches to knit,

a crochet hook can be easier to handle than a knitting needle. Slip the crochet hook through the stitch, grab the strand below, pull it through the stitch and then place on the knitting needle. This is faster and easier than using a needle, especially for the heel flap of a sock.

Adding a fringe

Use a crochet hook to thread and knot strands of yarn through the edge of your knitting to add a fringe.

Weaving in ends

An interesting web site for knitters is Knitty.com. It contains a pattern library full of free patterns for anything you would like to knit. The site is a condensed version of the online magazine Knittyspin. Check out the shawl pattern Lanesplitter which, Knitty claims, the bias fabric shawl/skirt has been knit by over 3000 knitters. There are also articles to read and tutorials and strangely enough ads which are interesting. Who knew ads were interesting?

We have a large amount of really high-quality yarn at the workshop which is not suitable for using in the items we make for donation into our communities. This is beautiful yarn from many well-known manufacturers: Rowan, Shalimar, Noro, etc. and consists of silk, soy, cashmere, linen, etc. Given that many of our recipients are immunocompromised, we do not use yarns which may cause them to be triggered in any way. However, we also dislike that we have so much yarn sitting around gathering dust. This, as you know, is why we hold our Dollar Daze events. Starting Saturday, February 1st, we will host a special, two-day, Donation Daze event at the workshop where the suggested donation for each and every skein of yarn in the event will be \$2.00. Two days in the second month when you can get great yarn for \$2 a skein.


Suggested donation, per skein, \$2

Plain Pillow Pony

1. Cut two from pattern plus a gusset strip 3" x 66(?)
2. Attaching the gusset is a little tedious because you don't have the squares to determine alignment so... As you reach each turning point mark the opposite side of the gusset strip so it will be aligned when you attach the other side.
3. Create the belly seam and trim the gusset strip.
4. Add a heart on the chest.
5. Attach the second side of the gusset, allowing an opening at the belly for stuffing.
6. Clip interior corners.
7. Stuff, stitch and add the tail and mane.
