As I'm sure you are aware, we are still not allowed to deliver your projects to all of the approximately 75 to 100 recipient locations as we have in the past years. At this point we, at most, are supplying items to about 30% of that total.

We have been fortunate to be able to find homes for almost everything you turn in at each drop off. In our search for recipients open to us, we have located a good number of areas new to us. For this reason, we have found a much larger need for hats and blankets of all sizes. We do use all the memory care items you turn in as well as things such as adult bibs and wheelchair/walker totes for assisted living areas.

I was fortunate to have a chat with a dialysis patient last week and he expressed his overwhelming surprise at being given one of your large, snuggly blankets. These patients also enjoy items such as arm warmers and fingerless mitts to comfort them during their frequent treatments.

Supplying items for cancer patients is down due to the caution taken with them. While undergoing their treatments, their immune systems are almost nonexistent, so extreme care is taken not to introduce outside threats to their environment.

So, bottom line... keep on keeping on! Continue with your beautiful stitches, your creative ideas and your loving, caring attitudes! You are keeping us all grounded and sane. You are definitely "the wind beneath our sails"

All our best to all of you, please do your very best to stay well and safe!

Tip of the Month Joining Your Circular Knitting to Avoid a Gap

When casting on, cast on one more stitch than the pattern calls for.

When you are ready to join your work, slip the first cast on stitch onto the left needle so it sits as the next stitch. Knit two stitches together (the first stitch is the one you moved over) and pull together firmly to prevent gap.

Place a marker to indicate the beginning of the row and knit around.

On the next row, when you reach the marker slip the first stitch, then continue knitting around.

Continue knitting as normal (i.e. do not slip the first stitch from here on).

Bears

Fredericksburg-King George Update

As the main point of contact for all of you in the Fredericksburg-King George area, I am fortunate to hear from many of you by phone call, email, or text during this time when we are unable to have our regular meetings. Some of you have had questions about what we need, where you can deliver the items you made, are we still able to provide items to all the same places and have our deliveries stopped because of the virus.

We started meeting in October 2011, so as we enter our 10th year, I wanted to provide everyone an update on our growth and delivery progress. Although we are not able to meet, we have certainly not slowed down at all with 2020 topping the delivery numbers from all other years! We are now delivering to over 62 locations. Although some are on hold currently, we will begin delivering to them when they allow, and we continually add new places. We are delivering items (as accepted due to Covid-19) to the City of Fredericksburg and to the following counties: King George, Caroline, Stafford, Spotsylvania, Orange, Culpeper and Louisa.

Every week I am getting text messages, phone calls or emails thanking us for what we do and saying how much they appreciate the beautiful work we deliver.

One thing that has amazed me is the number of brand-new members. People who have never been able to attend a meeting, yet they are stitching items! Many either delivering the items after calling me to find out where to take them while others turn them in at one of our drop-off days at the Ruritan.

This year has certainly been challenging and you have all been amazing with your response to the community's needs. This year will certainly top all other year's delivery numbers – yes, in part is due to the masks but the numbers are AMAZING!

I want to thank everyone who have contributed to what we have accomplished and look forward to the time when we can resume our meetings.

As you look at the recap of our deliveries by year, please keep in mind that each item delivered touches many more lives than just the person receiving it.

Update: Richmond area FtH Yarn Pick-ups and Items Drop-Offs

The new system we have put in place to facilitate people coming to the workshop to drop off items and to select yarn by appointment only is working well. Everybody has been very respectful of the need to honor the safety protocols we have put in place and so, given that it looks like this virus might be around for a while, the Board made the decision at our last Board meeting to continue to keep the workshop closed (except for the 1.5 hour drop-offs/pick-ups on Sunday afternoons) through the end of the year, at the earliest. This was not an easy decision for us to reach but, in the interest of the continued health and well-being of our membership, we thought it the wisest thing to do.

To give everyone a brief recap of how this all works, you do not need to make an appointment if you simply want to drop items off. What you drop off must be tagged and placed in a sealed, dated plastic bag. You can place more than one item in a plastic bag, but not more than one *type* of item. For example, you can put 10 children's hats in one bag and 5 bear outfits in another

bag but not 5 bear outfits and 10 hats in the same bag. Any type of plastic bag is fine – Ziploc, grocery store, trash bag, but they must be sealed and dated with the number and type of item inside written on the outside. This is to make sorting and distribution easier and safer for those who have volunteered to do this. You also do not need an appointment to pick up tags, yarn to make bear clothes, a bear to use as a model, fabric, etc. All these items will be outside, at the front of the workshop alongside the drop off bins, for you to both drop off and/or pick up without an appointment.

If you want to go inside the workshop to select yarn for your use in creating future From the Heart projects, you **DO NEED** an appointment. Each week, I will send out an email containing a unique link for you to use to make an appointment, using a program called SignUpGenius. This link will be different every week so please watch to use the latest email when you sign up to select yarn.

Please be aware that only people **with appointments** will be allowed to enter the workshop, **one** person per 10-minute time slot. Your temperature will be taken prior to your entering the workshop and you will be required to use the sanitizer on the front desk before going back to select yarn. Additionally, you **MUST** wear a facemask the entire time you are at one of these events, from the time you exit your car until you re-enter it to leave and you must practice social distancing at all times. As each visit is limited to 10 minutes, the bathroom will be off limits to all. Please bring your own bag if possible if you are getting yarn as we only have a limited number of bags at this time.

We have started using our log-in/log-out system again and you should start to record what you are bringing in and taking out at this point. Those who enter the workshop for yarn will also need to sign the sheet inside the workshop and give their phone number in the extremely unlikely event we might need it later.

I just want to add that I know all of this sounds onerous, but we are doing it in the interest of keeping us all safe and healthy and I am extremely grateful to everyone for their continued cooperation.

- Book totes for men (some totes for women are Ok but mostly men’s are needed)
- Shirt protectors – men and women, but mostly men
- Masks – don’t forget the men

4 Color Child's Knit Hat

Size: To fit Child size 5-7 (8-10, 11-up)

Materials: approx. 120 yds of worsted weight (#4) yarn in each of four coordinating colors (A, B, C, D)

Needles: US 6 & 8

Gauge: 18 sts = 4" over st st using size US 8 needles for hat.

Abbreviations:

K = knit,

p = purl,

st(s) = stitch(es)

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

k2tog = knit 2 sts together



Pattern:

Work in color pattern throughout Cast on with A. *Work 4 rows A, 2 rows color B, 2 rows C, 4 rows color D, 2 rows B. Repeat from *.

With smaller needles (size 6), loosely cast on 74 (82, 90) sts. Follow color pattern, working in 2X2 ribbing for 4", ending with a RS row. Change to larger needles (size 8) and begin stockinette stitch (knit RS row, purl WS row) working even for 3½ (4½, 5)", ending with a WS row.

Begin decreasing as follows:

Row 1: K1, *(Knit 6, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 2 and all WS rows to row 10: Purl.

Row 3: K1, *(Knit 5, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 5: K1, *(Knit 4, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 7: K1, *(Knit 3, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 9: K1, *(Knit 2, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 11: K1, *(Knit 1, k2tog); repeat from * across to last st, k1. Row 12: P1, *(p2tog); repeat from * across row to last st, p1.

Cut the yarn leaving a 12" tail, thread it through the remaining stitches, draw up tightly and secure. Sew up side seam, reversing sewing to inside at top of ribbing so it can flip up. Weave in all ends.

Quick Crochet Hat for A Child

Approx. 2 oz. worsted weight yarn

Size I (eye) crochet hook

For child's size:

Make 28 stitch chain.

Row 1: Half double crochet in second chain from hook and in each chain across the row.

Chain 2, turn.

Row 2 and all other rows: Half double crochet in top of first hdc of prior row and each hdc across the row.

Repeat row 2 until piece measures approximately 16 inches long.

Cut yarn, secure last stitch, and stitch ending edge to beginning edge.

With doubled yarn, make chain about 18 inches long. Thread this chain cord through top edge about 1 or 1.5 inches from edge, tie in bow.
