Tip of the Month Bleach Wool Test

We all tend to hold on to our leftover yarn but not always with the label. This test will let you determine if there is wool in that unlabeled yarn you added to your stash a year ago and now, have no idea what it is.

You will need glass or plastic dish to hold some bleach and a pair of tweezers (or other pokey tool) with which to maneuver your samples.

Pour a healthy portion of fresh bleach into the container. Put your sample yarn in the bleach. Poke the sample around to get it saturated. Leave it in the dish for at least one hour. If the sample dissolves it is an animal fiber such as wool, alpaca, mohair, etc. If it doesn't dissolve, although you may still have other questions about the yarn, you at least will know that there is no wool in it.

Note: Perform this test in a well-ventilated area.

Update: Richmond area FtH Yarn Pick-ups and Items Drop-Offs

Our weekly Sunday afternoon (1pm – 2:30pm) drop-off/pick-up events are working well and the plan is to continue until the weather makes it impossible to do so. You do not need to make an appointment if you simply want to drop items off or pick up tags, a teddy bear, fabric, and/or Ziploc bags. What you drop off must be tagged with a From the Heart logo tag, tied on to the item in a bow **not a knot**, and placed in a sealed, dated plastic bag. You can place more than one item in a plastic bag, but not more than one *type* of item. For example, tagged hats in one bag, tagged bear outfits in another bag, etc. can put 10 children's hats in one bag and 5 bear outfits Any type of plastic bag is fine – Ziploc, grocery store, trash bag, but they must be sealed and dated with the number and type of item inside written on the outside. This is to make sorting and distribution easier and safer for those who have volunteered to do this.

If you want to go inside the workshop to select yarn for your use in creating future From the Heart projects, you **DO NEED** an appointment. Each week, I will send out an email containing a unique link for you to use to make an appointment, using a program called SignUpGenius. This link will be different every week so please watch to use the latest email when you sign up to select yarn. Please be aware that only people **with appointments** will be allowed to enter the workshop, **one** person per 10-minute time slot.

Your temperature will be taken prior to your entering the workshop and you will be required to use the sanitizer on the front desk before going back to select yarn. Additionally, you **MUST** wear a facemask the entire time you are at one of these events, from the time you exit your car until you re-enter it to leave and you must practice social distancing at all times. As each visit is limited to 10 minutes, the bathroom will be off limits to all. Please bring your own bag if possible if you are getting yarn as we only have a limited number of bags at this time.

It is important that you understand we cannot take in any items which are untagged as a) we simply do not have the manpower to do it right now and b) we have implemented a system whereby the plastic bags containing items are “aged” for 8 days prior to opening. - Dressed 9” bears
- Bear Clothes to fit 9” bears
- Baby blankets
- Lap blankets
- Snuggle blankets
- Wheelchair blankets
- Dialysis blankets (min of 36”X42”)
- Dialysis mitts
- Hats in all sizes except preemie, scarves are optional
- COVID-19 items, masks, ear savers, surgical caps

Fredericksburg/King George has a need for:

- Hats – children through adult sized
- Baby hats but nothing smaller than a circumference of 16" (5.5" across the top of the rim when laid flat)
- Blankets – lap through bed size
- Book totes for men (some totes for women are Ok but mostly men’s are needed)
- Dignity bibs – men and women. You will find a pattern at the end of this newsletter
- Adult and children’s masks – don’t forget the men and boys
- Walker totes for men and women

Dignity Bib

You can use any size button up shirt.

This would be great for men or women. While women are content to wear the shirt protectors and men are more resistant so this would be a great solution.



Instructions:

1. Button the shirt and layout flat.
2. Cut off the sleeves leaving about ¼” of fabric for turning and stitching.



3. Turn shirt over to the back and cut up each of the sides of the shirt at the seam – all the way to the cross-piece seam (about shoulder length). Be sure to leave ¼” to turn and stitch.

NOTE: If there is not a shoulder piece stop about 4-6” below the collar. See the red box on the shirt as an example of the cross piece and this provides an idea how long the cross piece should be if you need to create one.



4. Final step is to stitch
 - Each of the two side seams
 - Each of the arm holes
 - Across the shoulder section of the back of the shirt.

Leave the shirt buttoned and it slips over their head. They love them as they don't feel they are wearing a bib!



When people are finally able to go out in public again, men and women would be more willing to wear this than a shirt protector.
