

Crochet a 12" square

Using Worsted Weight yarn - one square requires approximately 150 yards of yarn. That would be about 3 ounces of Red Heart Super Saver or similar yarn.

NOTE: Be sure to measure the chain to ensure it is 12 inches and then measure again when you have completed the first row of double crochet. You may need to adjust starting number of stitches if you crochet very tight or very loose.

Size I crochet hook:

Chain 40, measure to ensure it is 12 inches.

Double crochet in 3rd chain from the hook and in each chain to the end (37 DC).

Measure again now that you have completed the first row of double crochet and adjust if needed.

Chain 2 and turn.

Double crochet to the end, chain 2 and turn.

Continue until the piece measures 12 inches (22 rows)

Size J crochet hook:

Chain 39, measure to ensure it is 12 inches.

Double crochet in 3rd chain from the hook and in each chain to the end (36 DC).

Measure again now that you have completed the first row of double crochet and adjust if needed.

Chain 2 and turn.

Double crochet to the end, chain 2 and turn.

Continue until the piece measures 12 inches (21 rows)

Size K crochet hook:

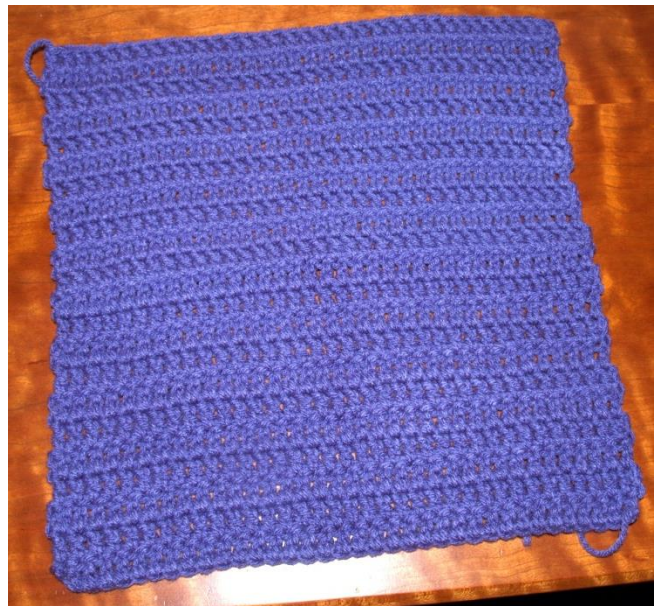
Chain 36, measure to ensure it is 12 inches.

Double crochet in 3rd chain from the hook and in each chain to the end (33 DC).

Measure again now that you have completed the first row of double crochet and adjust if needed. Chain 2 and turn.

Double crochet to the end, chain 2 and turn.

Continue until the piece measures 12 inches (20 rows)



Remember, you can really do any stitch or pattern it is just the size (12"x12") that is important.
