...sometimes we are like leftovers. As we are we all are wonderful, unique individuals. But, put us all together, what a colorful, fun bunch we are!

Very much like our yarn leftovers, amazing when gathered together. For example, we put many small, leftover yarn balls into a paper sack. Close it up tight and only open to randomly take out the very first ball our fingers touch. Whether we are stitching a chemo hat, shawl, lap blanket or blanket square, the end results are always amazing! Most often the project we create using these random balls is so bright and colorful and always a true hit with their recipient!

Lately we have filled many cubbies with yarn that has been already balled for you. Some started as hanks needing to be wound to make it usable. Others are true leftovers, but not always tiny bits but some significant amounts, enough for an entire project.

Some of the balls you'll see in the cubbies will have the original label attached in some manner, for others the label may be missing. But all of these balls are new or like new, just waiting to be chosen by an inspired stitcher, waiting to be turned into something that can be passed along to one of our many facilities housing ill or otherwise needy patients and residents.

Some of the smaller balls are truly leftovers from projects stitched in the past. You will find some of this type in baskets and cubbies in the yarn hall as well.

Next trip to drop off your finished items or to pick up Dove tags, take a look and all those wonderful offerings described above. Put together your own surprise bag or may just pick the perfect blend of colors for something you've been planning to try. Much like our members, meshed together we make such an incredible "blanket" to wrap snugly around those who need us the most!

- What supplies do you need?
 - fabric to make book totes or walker totes
 - tags so you can turn things in already tagged going forward
- If you need yarn:
 - What yarn would you prefer by weight and color
 - Weight = #4, #3 etc. or tell me if you want worsted, sport, chunky, etc.
 - Color, what color(s) or variegated
 - A big bag of leftovers for making???Leftovers are not limited as we have an abundant supply of them.
- Any other information you might think pertinent. Please feel free to share this information with anyone whom you think might want/need to know. Please tell other FTH members in case they are not aware of this event.

We will be open for receiving finished items and picking up supplies *only* – from 10:00 am – 12:00 noon. Click [here](#) for directions to the building. Current Needs – April 2022

Please tag items before bringing them to the workshop. It is no longer necessary to place them in plastic bags. If you do put your items in a plastic bag, please include a note to indicate what is in the bag. Please tie your tags in a BOW, as this is easy for our recipients to undo. Tags can be picked up any time the workshop is open. Anything intended to go to Vessels of Mercy should also include the words “Vessels of Mercy” on the bag. This will be a great assist to the Elves and/or members of the Sorting/Distribution Team when dealing with the many hundreds of items that come into the workshop every week.

Richmond and Surrounding areas have a need for:

- Large Blankets
- Memory Care Items
- Bear Outfits
- Soft Toys
- Hats
- Soft Chemo Hats (not cotton although cotton/acrylic blends are OK)
- Baby hats with bunny ears (for VCU/MCV)

Fredericksburg/King George has a need for:

- Cotton washcloths – **Please DO NOT tag** (tags are in the bags with the toiletries)
- Hats of all sizes - no baby hats please

While these two are our biggest needs, we could also use:

- Blankets – no smaller than 32”x32” and as large as twin bed size (baby, kids, men & women))
- Men’s wheelchair totes
- Dialysis mitts

At the end of this newsletter, you will find patterns for “generic” hats for children. These would work nicely for the bunny eared hats Richmond is still making for MCV. Just make ears for a bunny and attach. They would also work for the project we are working on with VOM for refugees from Ukraine.

What "Specialty" Items are at the Workshop?

There is a good amount of fabric available for those who like to sew items for From the Heart. It is kept on the shelf to the right as you enter the yarn hall. Patterns for dignity bibs, drain tube bags, underarm pillows, wheelchair and walker totes, and many other items can be found on our website [here](#).

We have bags of matched squares to be sewn together to create blankets on the wire shelving to the right as you

enter the yarn hall. Horseshoe shaped shawl kits are now available in brown grocery bags in front of this shelving. These bags contain sufficient yarn to complete a shawl, a small booklet with both knit and crochet patterns, and a tag to attach to your completed shawl.

Don't forget to pick up the tags you will need to add to your finished items.

Basic Crocheted Hat for an Older Child

Materials

Approximately 230 yards Worsted (#4) yarn

Size U.S. I crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

Gauge

11 sc and 13 rows = 4 ins.

Abbreviations

Ch	chain	rs	right side
sc	single crochet	rep	repeat
dc	double crochet	rnd	round
sl st	slip stitch		

Pattern

Ch 2.

1st rnd: (RS). 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st to first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. 2 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc. 12 sc.

3rd rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in next sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. 18 sc.

4th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 2 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. 24 sc.

5th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 3 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. 30 sc.

6th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 4 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. 36 sc.

7th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 5 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. 42 sc.

8th rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc.

Inc 6 sts evenly, as before, on next and every following alt rnd to 54 sc. Place marker at end of last rnd. (Note: this means each alternate round will be sc so 1 increase row, 1 sc round...)

Next rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc.

Rep last rnd until work from marked rnd measures 8" Fasten off.



Basic Knitted Hat on Circular Needles

Use worsted weight yarn (#4) and size 7 or 8 16" circular needles. Cast on 74 stitches
Work 1" ribbing (k1, p1)

Then work in stockinette (knit every round) until piece is a total length of 7.5"

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Using a tapestry needle, remove stitches one by one, purl wise, onto the tail of yarn.

Draw all stitches together tightly. Secure and weave in ends. Optional: Make a pompom or bow for the top.
