Letter from Lois – November 2022

With the changing weather comes the need for a bit of a change in the comfort projects we collect for those needing a special hug. With this in mind, as well as our upcoming November 13th Donations Daze, we are continuing our yarn supply shuffle.

We are finding so many great leftovers that, on their own, really aren't quite enough for an entire project. Beautiful colors and textures we've found, when combined into kits large enough for small projects, are much sought after by our members. These small kits contain enough yarn for various types of child or adult hats or scarves. In some cases you may find they hold just the right selection for a Fidget Lap Panel for residents in memory care facilities.

Larger kits most often are made up with the idea of creating lap blankets that are at least 36 to 40 inches or shawls. In some cases these selections are hidden in brown, paper, grocery bags and referred to as "mystery" kits. As you may remember, the stitcher is to reach into the bag without looking, pull out a ball of yarn...any ball...and begin stitching on their project. When this first ball is depleted, once again it is necessary to reach in, pick up a second ball...sight unseen...attach to the tail of first ball and continue stitching! These are enjoyable projects, creating the most interesting shawls and blankets and we've found they fast become favorites of anyone fortunate enough to receive them.

To continue with the need for warm items, if you enjoy stitching young children's (not infants) sweaters, here's a project for you! We have several recipients asking for these all through fall and winter.

Again this year we have a request from VCU Hospital's NICU department for holiday baby blankets made entirely with white yarn. These are used with the preemies during their photo sessions. When given the okay to go home with their families these will give an extra bit of warmth during their first trip out into the elements. We are looking for 60 of these, or as close to that count as possible.

Looking for something different to stitch? How about stuffed toys? If making these is enjoyable for you then we need you! We can find homes for any critters of approximately 8 to 10 inches tall...just the right size to become a best friend to a child going through health issues or maybe is just lonely and in need of a new buddy to hug.

Whatever you enjoy stitching will be welcomed by our recipients. Newborns, elderly, cancer, dialysis, memory care or veterans, homeless or hospice patients.

Everyone needs a little love now and then. Let's make From the Heart felt by as many in our communities as we possibly can. And, while we are at it, let's continue to add to our total donation count of well over 500,000 items since our very first donation way back in 2001!

Keep on smilin' and stitchin'!

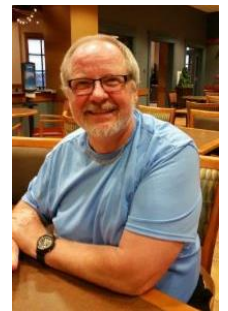

While we have occupied this store front space at [1320 Central Park Blvd., Suite #108 in Fredericksburg](#) for

about four years, recent modifications to its use have opened up permanent opportunities for our broader membership to fully participate in its mission. The workshop has the blessing of our Property Manager, and we comply with all insurance requirements as well. Many of us have wanted a place like the Westbriar workshop for a long time. With time and participation, the use of this great space will only improve.

An increase in the number of volunteers will improve the number of days the workshop can be opened. I hope to see you there soon, even if you are just dropping off finished items and picking up new yarn/fabric/notions of your choice. To provide a safe and efficient environment, there will always be a minimum of 2 helpers for the 10am-2pm hours of operation on the designated days of the month the workshop is open.

Based on the experience of previous helpers, you can choose to help by being a greeter/meeter, showing newcomers and regular members where to sign in items and aiding with signing out of yarns, fabric and miscellaneous notions and items. Some people like to sort yarn, others bag items that are either delivered or picked up by recipients of all our beautiful work. Some like to make calls from their own home to places we deliver to see what their current needs are. Others can help by keeping an eye on our finished items inventory, so we have enough to go around. There are more opportunities as well and when you visit, *you* decide if, how and when you can donate your time in increments of 2 hours.

When you visit the workshop for the first time, take your time and enjoy the facility! We will not always have a need to sign up online, or impose time restrictions, which were only designed to help us balance the flow of members and/or to track members if there were ever a situation where the workshop and people inside became exposed to various contagions. As we begin to open up our Fredericksburg location for our FtH members, the sign-ups are necessary so that we don't get overwhelmed initially. Richmond, for example, does not require people to sign up to visit their workshop and we hope to get to that point as soon as possible. Until we do, we will be sending emails with future dates of openings and sign-up opportunities so keep watch on your emails. If you do not have access to the internet, please contact Maria Zabko at yakitty@aol.com as she will be able to reserve a place for you.

BTW! The Fredericksburg workshop will be mask optional. Hurray!

Although Richmond still has the mask mandate still in place for their workshop visitors, this decision is something that the BOD has repeatedly said was **OUR** decision to make at our meetings.

As a reminder: All From the Heart drop off/pick-ups at the Ruritan Club are canceled for the remainder of 2022.

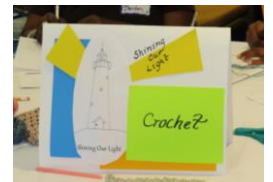
Found At the Retreat

A Better Way to Store Your Scarves and Shawls



Gently rolling your hand-made scarves and shawls and storing them in a drawer or on a shelf rather, than hanging or folding them, is an excellent way to avoid the creases caused by

folding and/or the stretching caused by hanging. Give it a try – it works like a charm.

- Hats of all sizes
- Scarves
- Lap blankets, no smaller than 32” X 32”, no larger than 32” X 36”
- Large blankets – up to twin bed size
- Please note Fredericksburg does not need washcloths at the moment but, if that is what you enjoy making, please continue to do so as we will certainly need them again at a future date

Richmond

- Teal chemo hats – yarn available in basket at workshop
- Baby hats to fit a 5” ball
- WHITE baby blankets approx. 36” square for VCU (needed by early December)
- 8” squares with long tails – do not tag

- Regular length mitts (with fingers for children)
- Regular fingerless mitts for adults
- Colorful Blankets for palliative care, 42” x 60” to 72” and
- Small toys for children
- Outfits for bears and dogs. We have the cutest bears and dogs available to dress just in time for the holidays. The stuffed dogs are just a bit bigger than the bears. Use your creative juices to dress and decorate several for local children. Crocheted, Simple, Easy Blanket

Size: Pattern as written = 28 inches square but size will vary depending on yarn and hook used.

For larger sizes: chain an even number of stitches to measure the desired square, then one more chain. Example: For a 40-inch square, chain enough stitches (even number) to create a 40 inches plus one more chain. Next follow the directions as shown above for rows 1 and 2.

Materials

Approx. 8 oz. baby yarn or light worsted

Size I (for baby) or K (for worsted)

Abbreviations

ch(s) = chain(s)

dc = double crochet sc = single crochet

For a 28" square: chain 101.

Row 1:

Sc and dc in 2nd ch from hook, *skip 1 ch, sc and dc in next ch; rep from * across. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2:

Sc and dc in first dc, *skip next sc, sc and dc in next dc; rep from * across, skip last sc, chain 1 and turn. Repeat row 2 for pattern, Continue until the blanket measures 10 inches long, fasten off. Follow pattern completing Row 1 and 2. Repeat row 2 until the blanket measures the desired length.



Knit Simple Diagonal Blanket Square

This pattern starts at one corner, grows out to two corners and decreases to the fourth corner, made all in one piece.

Size: Adjustable. With needle size 7, 8, 9, 10 or 10 ½ use single strand, worsted weight yarn, With needle size 11, 13, or 15 use double strand worsted weight yarn.

Cast on 4 stitches.

Row 1: Knit 2 stitches. Yarn Over (YO) the needle, knit to end, Turn

Row 2: Knit 2, YO, Knit to end, turn.

Row 3: K2, YO, Knit to end of row, turn.

Row 4: K2, YO, Knit to end of row, turn.

Subsequent rows: Continue as above, always knitting the first 2 stitches and wrapping yarn over needle then continuing to knit remainder of row.

When the one side edge of the piece measures the width you want the blanket to be (this will be half the square), begin your decrease.

To decrease: K1, K2 together, YO, K2 together, continue to knit to end of row. Continue above with each row until you are down to 5 stitches.



Bind off (cast off) these 5 stitches.
