

Continuing From the Heart's Soft Reopening

The From the Heart workshop is open from 10am until 2pm 4 days a week: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday. The total number allowed inside the workshop at any given time continues to be capped at 10, which includes the 2 Elves. To comply with current CDC guidelines, we are requiring that masks be worn by those who come into the workshop.

You may enter the workshop to get yarn and, if you are not staying, you will not be included in the count of 10 people. We are continuing to keep a written record of who enters, although we will no longer take temperatures as you enter.

Please do not come to the workshop if you have a cold or other illness or have been in the company of someone who has been, or is, ill.

Please continue to tag your completed projects before dropping them off but it is no longer necessary to bag them, with the exception of items intended for Vessels of Mercy International. If you do bag them, please include a list of what is in the bag.

There will be a bin outside for you to drop your items into if you don't want to enter the workshop. Please note you do not need to enter the workshop or sign in if you are simply dropping items in the bin outside.

Letter from Lois – January 2022

We know it's coming, happens every year in our area. I'm talking about those freezing temperatures, cold, cold rain and just sometimes, SNOW!

Most all of us are prepared, some are even anxiously awaiting to see those beautiful, white flakes floating down, creating the beginnings of a winter wonderland.

As I said, most all of us are prepared...but what about those in our communities who aren't prepared, can't find a warm, cozy place for watching that snow come down. Those are the folks who are on our radar. This is a huge concern for so many of us, just wanting to do all we can for those less fortunate than we are. From the Heart has always, for all of our 20 years, worried about being able to do more for those who are homeless or very near being in that situation. We continue this year to put a very large part of our focus on finding ways to assist in this area. We have yarn at our disposal, we have the tools and most important, we have ample talent. So, let's concentrate here for a minute and come up with a true plan to put our resources to good use.

We need LARGE blankets...at least 60 to 72 inches long and wide enough to cover a cot or twin-size bed. If you are anything like me, you are simply overwhelmed at the thought of working on a project for sooooooo long...long enough to create a blanket large enough that it will truly make a difference. What I'm thinking will work out best for all of us is 12-inch acrylic squares! Not 11 or 13 but a true 12 inches. Rather than stitch and stitch on a project that (in my case) never seems to grow large enough to make a difference, suppose we just take the leftover yarn from our prior projects and make a square or two before tackling the next scarf or hat. Little by little, with a lot of help from our fellow stitchers, we will have 12 or 15 acrylic squares that can be stitched into a bit of loving warmth for someone shivering on a street corner, in a back alley or under a bridge. These acrylic squares should not be tagged as they many will be sewn into one item which will then be tagged. If possible, please leave a 15" yarn tail to be used for sewing them together.

While we still will need those warm hats, scarves, and mittens, give this blanket idea some thought. If we can each just turn in a square or two, think of the difference we could make toward keeping someone unfortunate a bit warmer while they are battling problems we cannot even imagine.

- If you need yarn:
 - What yarn would you prefer by weight and color
 - Weight = #4, #3 etc. or tell me if you want worsted, sport, chunky, etc.
 - Color, what color(s) or variegated
 - A big bag of leftovers for making??? We have an abundant supply of them.
- Any other information you might think pertinent

This rule applies regardless of where you live. In Richmond, we look at Chesterfield, Henrico, Hanover, and Richmond City schools. In Fredericksburg, it would be Spotsylvania. If your schools are closed/opening late, your meeting spot will be closed. A notice will be sent out on Friday evening if we need to close on a Saturday, as the schools cannot be the guide in that instance. New Short Term From the Heart Project Baby Valentine Red Hats with White Hearts

Following the segment on CBS6 news, I was contacted by Shannon Brooks Armes, mother of Skylar Jean Armes, who was stillborn on October 21, 2016. Shannon started a charitable group in memory of Skylar and delivers red baby hats with white hearts on them to Henrico Drs. Hospital every year to be given, as a token of love and in honor of Skylar, to babies born there in February. Shannon asked if From the Heart would be in a position to help with this endeavor this year. The Board voted, at the last Board meeting, to help as much as possible in the time remaining until it is necessary to get the hats to Shannon for delivery to the hospital.

These full-term baby hats can be knit or crochet, any stitch or pattern, any weight yarn with the exception of chunky/bulky. They need to be red and include a white heart somewhere, if possible, although red hats with heart shapes clearly visible in the pattern are also OK. If necessary, a white heart securely fastened to a red hat is also fine. To crochet a heart to attach to your red hat, click the link below. Crochet the heart in white yarn.

If you find or want to use a pattern which has straps, please do not include the straps when making your item.

These hats need to be delivered to From the Heart no later than Saturday, January 22 in order to be available to Shannon and then to Henrico Drs. before February.

"My Teacher Daughter"

"My teacher daughter told me that her students did not have scarves or hats several years ago during a particularly cold month. It was during a conversation where she and I were talking about the stresses on teachers.

One of my knitting groups was making hats and scarves for Richmond City Schools. It occurred to me that my daughter's class needed my hats more. So, I made hats in various sizes to fit over smooth hair, curly hair, afro hair, big heads and little heads and medium size heads. I made long scarves for the taller students and medium scarves for the shorter girls and boys.

The colors came from my stash. Wild colors and muted colors and everything in between. There was every kind of yarn imaginable --thick, thin, furry.

This year I sent her 45 hats of various sizes and 58 scarves for the kids to select from. They pair up the hat with a scarf and according to my daughter they love it. And every day she wants to know where the hats are that belong on their heads and the scarves around their neck. What a great teacher!"

Vessels of Mercy, on one evening alone, distributed From the Heart created hats, mitts, scarves, and other items to 674 people in underserved areas of Richmond.



Communities in Schools, Chesterfield Co., distributed hats and toys as part of their annual holiday outreach to 200 in-need elementary aged school children in the county.

From the Heart started distribution of our new toiletry bags. Only 51 have been distributed so far but, as the song goes, "We've only just begun."

Tags can be picked up any time the workshop is open. Anything you intend to go to Vessels of Mercy International should also include the words "Vessels of Mercy" on the bag. This will be a great assist to the Elves and/or members of the Sorting/Distribution Team when dealing with the many hundreds of items that come into the workshop every week.

Tip of the Month Weaving in Ends as You Work

Join your new working yarn (shown in gray here), knit the first stitch then hold the new yarn in your right hand. The tails or ends of your gray and pink will be held in your left hand (but only for a few stitches).



Insert your right needle into the

next stitch but do not knit it yet. Pull the tails of your pink and gray over and around to the front of your work.

Now wrap the right needle with your new gray yarn, move the pink and gray tails to the back, and pull the stitch off.



Knit the next stitch as normal.

Repeat these steps until you have wrapped three or four stitches total. The result is a non-bulky and neat wrong side.

Newborn Baby Hat (Knit)

1 skein Joann's Big Twist will make quite a few of these little hats with yarn left over. Any soft #4 yarn can also be used. Just be sure to use **soft** worsted (#4) weight yarn.

Using either long size 7 needle for magic loop or double point needles. (16" circular is not suitable for knitting these small tube hats.)

Cast on 44 stitches. Join carefully being certain stitches are not twisted. Work in knit 2, purl 2 ribbing for 32 rounds.

Round 33: Knit 2, purl 2 together. Repeat around the Round (33 sts.)

Round 34: Knit 2 together, purl 1. Repeat around the Round (22 sts.)

Round 35: Knit 2 together around (11 sts).

Round 36: Knit 2 together 5 times. Knit 1 (6 sts).



Cut yarn, thread thru tapestry needle, pull thru remaining 6 stitches, snug up smoothly, weave in tail. Weave in tail at beginning cast on. Voila! It's done!

Crocheted Baby Hat

F hook and Sport Weight Yarn (I used Baby Soft)

To begin: Chain 27

NOTE: Turn and ch 1 at the end of all odd rows.

Row 1 – sc in 2nd chain from hook and in each chain across (26 sc)

Row 2 – sc in 20 sc (do not sc in last 6 sc), turn (do not ch 1)

Row 3 – sc in 20 sc, back to beginning

Row 4 – sc in 20 sc and in 2 sc in Row 2 (22 sc) (do not sc in last 4 sc in Row 2) turn (do not ch 1)

Row 5 – sc in 22 sc back to beginning

Row 6 – sc in 22 sc and in 2 sc in Row 2 (24 sc) (do not sc in last 2 sc in Row 2) turn (do not ch 1)

Row 7 – sc in 24 sc back to beginning

Row 8 – sc in 24 sc and in remaining 2 sc in Row 2 (26 sc), turn (do not ch 1) Row 9 – sc in 26 sc back to beginning.



Repeat Rows 2 thru 9 until the circumference of the hat is about 16"

Finish off; leave a long tail for sewing up seam. Fold piece in half and sew two sides together to form hat. Run yarn through stitches at top of hat to close. Turn up about a 2" cuff when finished.

You can experiment with a G or H hook and other yarns to make larger hats.

If you want to make one of these hats for our Valentine Baby Hat project (see article), please make the hat in a soft RED yarn and attach a WHITE heart to it. Below is a link to a pattern for a crocheted heart.
